Aims
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Improving four language skills : reading, writing, listening and speaking Acquiring a methodology to improve your skills yourself in an academic environment Exercising your oral expression in French in monologue and in interaction Discovering your cultural and cross-cultural environment Upgrading and deepening your grammatical and lexical knowledge
Methodological Approach and Teaching Method and Tools
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Teaching is focused on communicating, interacting and apprehending cross-cultural differences. The learning aims, process and contents are based on the CECRL (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages). Working on all the language skills (speaking, listening, writing and reading) Various course material : authentic documents, documents created by teachers, teaching sheets from textbooks and French as a Foreign Language websites Equipped training rooms In addition to the training, students can access the Language Center (books, magazines, DVDs, computers, conversation clubs, speaking workshops, individual counselling) and to the self-learning platform called EDOLang
Training Content Examples
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Giving your opinion ; presenting your arguments, reacting to smb's speech and discussing Structuring your oral and written speech Giving an oral presentation (on topics related to students' speciality fields) Writing formal emails Understanding a press article or a report on a news item, informative and argument-based texts Understanding a written or oral documents Remedial help for pronunciation/phonetics and working to your needs Remedial help for grammar and working to your needs Role-playing games
Organisation of the Training
<p>This module in French is a 44-hour unit (4 hours per week for 11 weeks) , it allows you to get 3 ECTS There are 20 students per group at the most. The training takes place :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In Metz, on the Ile du Saulcy campus, In Nancy: on the campus of Letters and Human Sciences, at the Faculty of Medicine (for Erasmus students of the health sector).
Assessments System
Continuous assessment , and the mark is based on 2 tests of written and/or oral skills
